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

Have you ever participated in a competition? I have participated in a few competitions. Each of them had its own criteria to win. Who made those rules? I don't know. Some of them existed for years. But those who participate in those competitions should agree to abide by these rules. In some bicycle races, speed is the criteria to win; but in certain others, slowness is the requirement to win. But in any case they all have to abide by the rules and they all should accept the final judgement of the jury. Rules, regulations, instructions, recipes, protocols, are all there for a reason and hence we have to follow. But my father used to say:, "Rules are for fools!" He never meant not to follow the rules; but he was trying to teach us that the laws are made for the people; and an intelligent or smart person should asses the situation and should decide for himself whether he should blindly follow the rules or break the rules for the betterment of humanity. In this case the jury is oneself. Everyone has to take the responsibility for

his own actions. And he should be ready to face the consequences of his actions.
